1. APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION FOR THE SALE OF WEST END SCHOOL

That the Board approve the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION TO SELL WEST END SCHOOL

RECITALS

- A. The Board of Education of the City of Long Branch, in the County of Monmouth ("Board of Education") is the owner of a school and school site located at 132 West End Avenue, in the City of Long Branch, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, also known as Block 123, Lot 13 on the Official Tax Map of the City of Long Branch, Monmouth County, New Jersey which school and site are collectively referred to herein as the "West End School";
- B. The Board of Education no longer is in need of the West End School to educate students attending the Long Branch Public Schools as several new schools have been constructed which can adequately house the students formerly located in the West End School;
- C. The Board of Education has heretofore filed with the Department of Education a Long-Range Facilities Plan in which the Board of Education, in cooperation with the Department of Education, agreed to remove the West End School from the inventory of schools maintained by the Board of Education;
- D. The Board of Education has attempted on several occasions to sell the West End School in accordance with the statutes of the State of New Jersey, *N.J.S.A.* 18A:1-1 *et seq.*;
- E. Pursuant to said statutes, the Board of Education sought bids for the sale of the West End School which bids were opened on January 22, 2014. Menachem Learning Institute, a New Jersey Non-Profit corporation, ("Menachem") was the successful bidder, and thereafter a Purchase and Sale Agreement ("PSA") was signed between the Board of Education and Menachem which contained a mortgage contingency clause providing *inter alia* that the PSA was contingent upon Menachem obtaining a first mortgage loan by March 30, 2014, in the amount not exceeding eighty (80%) percent of the purchase price;
- F. Prior to the expiration of the mortgage contingency time period, the Board of Education was advised by Menachem that it was not able to obtain a mortgage in the amount of eighty (80%) percent of the purchase price. Accordingly, the PSA was terminated and the deposit returned to Menachem;

1. APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION FOR THE SALE OF WEST END SCHOOL (continued)

- G. The Board of Education conducted a second attempt to sell the West End School by seeking competitive bids for a bid opening on July 15, 2014. On July 15, 2014, no bids were received. Accordingly, pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 18A:20-7, the Board of Education is permitted to negotiate for the sale of the West End School;
- H. By letter dated January 23, 2015, Jeffrey Resnikoff, Esquire, submitted an offer to purchase the West End School on behalf of his client New Jersey Repertory Company as follows:
 - 1. The purchase price of \$2,250,000.00 is to be paid in cash;
 - 2. A 120 day period of due diligence is required;
- 3. The re-zoning, creation of an overlay zone or a use variance for the West End School to allow the use of the West End School as (i) a theater and to provide further education and support for the use of special functions to include office space, conference space, music, choral, instrumental, photography, art gallery and set design; (ii) the use of the West End School to accommodate actor housing; (iii) a new theater which would allow 225-250 seats and be approximately 16,000 square feet and include a sky-lit atrium space for a lobby; (iv) acceptable parking at the West End School in conformity with the Land Use Regulations of the City of Long Branch consisting of 80 site spaces; and (v) a closing to occur sixty (60) days after all contingencies have been satisfied.
- I. The Board of Education is willing to enter into a PSA with the New Jersey Repertory Company in a form satisfactory to the Board of Education and its legal counsel, incorporating those terms as set forth in the previous Recitals; and
- J. The PSA will provide that the Deed to be given to New Jersey Repertory Company will include a Covenant Running with the Land which will state as follows:

The Deed from Seller ("Board of Education") to Purchaser (New Jersey Repertory Company) shall contain a covenant running with the land which will provide that the Property (including the School and Site) may not be used for a public school, private school or charter school without the express written consent of the Seller which consent Seller may grant or deny in its sole and absolute discretion.

For purposes of the PSA only, the Board of Education will consent to waiving the Covenant Running with the Land solely for New Jersey Repertory Company for the uses aforesaid, however, the Covenant Running with the Land shall continue to run with the land and shall be binding on the heirs, successors, assigns and purchasers of the West End School from New Jersey Repertory Company and all future heirs, successors, and assigns.

1. APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION FOR THE SALE OF WEST END SCHOOL (continued)

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board as follows:

- 1. The Recitals set forth above are incorporated into and made a part of this Resolution.
- 2. The attorney for the Board of Education is hereby authorized and directed to prepare a PSA between the Board of Education and the New Jersey Repertory Company which will generally include those terms of the offer set forth in the Recitals and such other terms as said attorney deems appropriate.
- 3. At such time as the PSA has been prepared in form satisfactory to the New Jersey Repertory Company and the Board of Education, the President and Secretary of the Board of Education respectively are hereby authorized and directed to sign the PSA and to take any and all other actions necessary to fulfill its terms and conditions; provided, however, that until the PSA is signed by the Board of Education and the New Jersey Repertory Company, neither shall have any obligation to the other.

Comments from the Personnel Committee Chair (APPENDIX O-2)

Dr. Critelli – The Personnel Committee met on February 11 2015. You can find the agenda items listed on the back of tonight's agenda, Appendix O-2. We currently have open certified positions for a chemistry teacher, bilingual supervisor and K-5 humanities/science supervisor. We also discussed workers' compensation and personnel currently out of work. We spent some time discussing TEACH NJ which focuses on the teachers' evaluation system that is currently in place. A discussion centered on the multiple measures of performance to evaluate teachers. These measures include components of both student performance and teacher practice. There are different levels of rating. Teachers do receive an annual summative evaluation. The evaluation rating includes highly effective, effective, partially effective or ineffective. 84% of our staff scored effective or highly effective.

Comments from the Athletics Committee Chair (APPENDIX 0-3)

Mr. Dangler – The Athletics Committee met on February 10, 2015. We discussed the recognition of a former student who was an NFL stand out, USFL stand out and All Pro, Sam Mills. At the first Friday night football game of the 2015 – 2016 school year we are planning to have a plague with an encouraging message in memory of Sam mounted outside of the locker room as well as one of his football jerseys from his years of playing in the NFL. We plan to contact his family, friends and former teammates to participate. This will begin approximately one hour prior to the start of the game. We also plan to have a screen dropped over the school wall to show the spectators the plague. The committee also voted to bring the Hall of Fame recognitions back. It has been at least 5 years since the last event took place. The Athletic Hall of Fame will be celebrated in conjunction with Senior Recognition on June 2, 2015 to show the students the history of Long Branch and the accomplishments of student athletes. The Academic Hall of Fame will be held in conjunction with Scholarship night in May. Applications for each event will be going out shortly.
