A-1. STATEMENT OF THE MANNER OF NOTIFICATION OF THE MEETING

Peter E. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

1. COMMITTEE MEETING REPORTS

A) OPERATION AND MANAGEMENT – ARMAND ZAMBRANO - Chair

Mr. Zambrano stated that the Operation and Management meeting took place on May 9, 2012 and reported on the following:

- Ground breaking for the George L. Catrambone School will take place sometime in July
- Exxon Mobil is conducting remediation work at the bus depot located on West End Avenue
- Work at the Morris Avenue School is scheduled to begin at the end of the school year and should be completed by the end of August. We are considering the purchase of new furniture for the school
- Evergreens by the football field are being replaced
- Trees and shrubbery are being replaced by the High School for the upcoming graduation ceremony
- Sand from the volley ball court is being combined with dirt to create a berm around the west side of the High School
- Ceiling tiles are being replaced and grids are being painted at the Morris Avenue School and Audrey W. Clark School
- The Technology Department has created more back up storage for district computers

Mr. Zambrano asked Mr. Genovese to discuss the Energy Education position.

Mr. Genovese – As of today we have 7 applicants for the position, all of which are internal candidates as was suggested by the company. They are teachers as well as facilitators. The salary range is strong, \$84,000 to \$94,000.

Mr. Grant – What position is this?

Mr. Genovese – Educational Energy Specialist which is hired by the energy education company. The person will be working nights and weekends, basically whenever the schools are closed, to review the energy usage, manage systems, watch utility bills.

Mr. Grant – How long will this be?

Mr. Genovese – The company will be with us for approximately 5 years. Their fees and the energy specialist's fees will come out of the savings.

Mr. Salvatore – There was an article in the newspaper this week about Holmdel saving \$3.5 million and they had recommended the company to us.

Mr. Parnell – What happens if there isn't a qualified candidate within the district?

Mr. Genovese – I suspect that would allow us to go to the outside. It is the company's call because we have asked them to hire the position. The concern we have is that the salary does not come with health benefits or any type of pension system. It would be a perfect match for someone on the verge of retirement.

Mr. Parnell – This position does not come with health benefits?

Mr. Genovese – No, that is probably why the salary is so attractive. There is a job information session on May 24, 2012 at 3:30 P.M. here at 540 Broadway.

Mr. Parnell – Only for district candidates?

Mr. Genovese – Yes. They are hoping some Board members and administrators will attend to understand the program.

Mr. Zambrano – How long is the training for this program?

Mr. Salvatore – I have reviewed the 7 candidates that have applied in house. A lot of them are teachers. I think the salary is very appealing to people but it doesn't talk about nights, holidays, weekends and summers. So when you look at the salary you think it's a great jump but it didn't describe when they would be coming in to work and the fact that they would be leaving the pension system. I think that when we start talking about details a lot of people will pull their names off of the list.

Mr. Parnell – Can you let us know if the search goes outside of the district?

Mr. Genovese – Yes.

Mr. Grant – It is anticipated we will have considerable savings?

Mr. Genovese – Yes, there was an analysis done that projects we will have probably \$300,000 to \$400,000 per year in utility savings which is substantial.

Mr. Grant – We are committed for 5 years?

Mr. Genovese – Yes, we pay them for 5 years as long as there are savings. If not then they get nothing and they write us a check. After 5 years it is our option to pick up the energy specialist or to go out and re-hire a new energy specialist but they will continue the training program for our people. We pay them for 5 years but have them for life as far as their resources are concerned. We pay a minimal annual fee for software management to keep up the licensing.

Mr. Grant – Who is the company that we hired?

Mr. Genovese – Energy Education. They are from Texas. Ann Degnan will be the point of contact on our behalf and will receive similar training that the Energy Education Specialist will go through so that our person on staff will have a complete understanding of the program and will be able to watch the savings to make sure that we are getting what they say we are getting. It is a very comprehensive program. We have talked to

about 6 different departments within the organization. Each one represents a different facet of the organization.

Mrs. Perez – A retired person can do this. It wouldn't affect their pension.

Mr. Grant – When we built the new schools I hope we put in some of the controls.

Mr. Genovese – They are in and they take all of that into account including our solar panels and any other adjustments we may have. They will also make adjustments down the road for any capital work we may want to do but we are not required to do that.

Mr. Grant – They will give us some return and if they don't what happens?

Mr. Genovese – They are responsible for any cost incurred that are not covered by our savings.

Mr. Grant – When I was in East Orange we did something with energy and we used Johnson Controls out of Texas. I don't remember saving much money at the time, agreed we didn't have new facilities with insulation, etc.

Mrs. Perez – What is the status of the old High School building?

Mr. Salvatore – They issued an unsafe structure notice to us so we had a meeting with our new liaison from the Department. They apparently changed personnel and we have a new person. They didn't tell us but we found out about it. We called and asked if there was someone new working on our case. They said yes and that they hadn't gotten around to telling us. He came out and met with myself, Pete and Ann and we went through the whole story again. I told him how much we appreciate the new school that is being built and the impending ground breaking, and then we went right to the old High School and started talking about that. I feel like it's Groundhogs Day because every time I go to the SDA there is a new person involved and I have to explain the whole story all over again, and I told him that to. We had a functional building, there was a contract to demolish part of the building and restore it. I told him students were in the building in June of 2007 and it is not functional at this point. He said that the contract talked about demolition. The people who worked in the building saw it as "demo". They didn't read all of the specs because there was demolition.

Mrs. Perez – Aren't you over there everyday? How come nobody noticed that?

Mr. Genovese – We weren't allowed in the building.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT (continued)

B) INSTRUCTION AND PROGRAMS – LUCI PEREZ - Chair

Mrs. Perez reported that the Committee met on May 9, 2012 and discussed the following:

- A new language arts curriculum will be implemented by district teachers for the 2013 school year
- The program "Treasures" will replace SFA in grades K – 6
- Students will remain in their classrooms and be grouped by reading levels
- In-services for teachers will be available all summer as well as during the school year. Principals will be required to attend the training sessions as well
- Implementation of Instructional learning pods in Grades 7 – 8 was also discussed. Each pod will be made up of 100 students with teachers from language arts, math, science, social studies and electives providing instruction in these individual subject areas rather than 1 teachers teaching all subjects
- The administration is also reviewing a revision of report cards to make them more standards based, aligning them with common core standards
