Mr. Salvatore reviewed the Agenda with the Board of Education.

1. PERSONNEL

a) RESOLUTIONS – Release from Suspensions (APPENDIX E)

Mr. Salvatore – I am recommending to the Board that we remove Donna Perreira and Lauren Bland from suspension. Institutional Abuse has reviewed the case and they are not going to pursue any further action. It was their feeling that the child was never in danger. The mistake was made with the head count of the children on the bus. Seman Tov is responsible for removing the seat belts of all of the children, insuring that there are no children left on the bus as well as checking to make sure that the same number of students leaving the bus matches the list that our instructional assistants use.

There was discussion by many Board members with respect to the incident. Some Board members felt that the staff members should be terminated.

Mr. Salvatore – Our staff's job description is to check off the students that are on the bus, but it was not their responsibility to insure that every child comes off of the bus. That was the responsibility of Seman Tov. However, I will be looking into making some changes to the current responsibilities to further insure student safety.

Fougere Ferrier, union representative for the American Federation of Teachers, spoke on behalf of the employees. He stated that the instructional assistants have a large responsibility in helping the children get off the bus and into their classes. They have been doing this job for years. This one mistake should not rise to the level of causing their termination.

John Severs, President of the LBFT, also spoke on behalf of the instructional assistants. He asked the Board to consider their past performances and to allow the 2 individual's to return to work

With no further comments or questions from the Board, Mr. Ferrier and Mr. Severs left the room.

The Board took a consensus to remove the 2 instructional assistants from suspension.

Mr. Salvatore — I took a lot of this into consideration with respect to transfers which is why not many people were moved around so as not to inflame the situation any further.

Mrs. Beams – I have heard a lot about this incident and there were similar issues with this individual at a previous school.

Mr. Salvatore - Those allegations were all anonymous.

Mr. Genovese – I haven't received anything to this point.

Mr. Parnell – An individual having a class reunion asked me if I knew where a cement plague was that used to be at the Elberon School. The person was interested in securing the plague for their reunion.

Mr. Parnell – Luci Perez, Bill Dangler and I met with Carl Jennings with regard to working with the Recreation Department to promote sports at the Grades 3 -5 level. The meeting was very positive and we should be able to support many of their activities.
