A-1. STATEMENT OF THE MANNER OF NOTIFICATION OF THE MEETING

Peter E. Only then is it placed on the agenda for action at a public meeting. In rare instances, matters are presented to the Board of Education for discussion at the same meeting that final action may be taken.
