- 1. What are some factors that determine long term career opportunities or job openings?
- 2. Chart 1. Numeric change in the population and labor force:
  - What is projected to happen to the population and labor force between the years, 2008-2018?
  - In your opinion and knowing what is projected to happen to the population and labor force, what types of goods and services will be increasing in demand during that time period, 2008-2018? Explain.
  - What jobs are related to the production and distribution of those goods and services? Explain.

### 3. Chart 2. Percent of labor force, by race and ethnic origin:

A. What changes are the changes occurring between the various ethnic groups from 2008 - 2018?



- B. If you are an employer what are some steps you might take to ensure that you will have skilled workers in the future? Explain.
- C. The male labor force will grow by 7.5%; however, the female portion of the labor force will increase by 9.0%. As more women enter the workforce, what issues will employers have to face in the future from this shift, in your opinion? Explain.

A. Explain the relationships within the various age groups in the labor force. Which are growing? Which are declining?

- B. What are some possible consequences for the trend in the 16-24? Explain.
- C. What could happen because of the trend in the 55 and over age group? Explain.

### 5. Chart 4. Numeric change in wage and salary employment in goodsproducing industries, 2008-18 (projected):

A. What does the trend indicate for those looking for employment in the goods-producing industries? Explain.



- B. Many of these industries do not require employees to acquire education past the secondary level. What implications does this projected trend have on high school graduates deciding whether to continue their education? Explain.
- C. In your opinion, what relationship is there between education and long term availability of jobs? Explain.

  - B. How much is it expected to grow by?
  - C. Explain why this group is expected to grow.
